Richard Danbury holds a BA in Philosophy from Cambridge University and a Diploma in Law from the College of Law, London. He was called to the Bar in 1994 and in 1996 became a barrister at 9-12 Bell Yard (http://www.9-12bellyard.com), before leaving a year later to write travel guide books. He joined the BBC as a researcher in 1999, on the programme Rough Justice. He has worked primarily in TV Current Affairs, and mainly for Newsnight and Panorama. For Newsnight, he won a New York Festivals Bronze Medal for producing *Medicating to Execute* with Tim Samuels. In 2004, as Associate Producer for Panorama, he was part of the team that won an RTS, Best Home Current Affairs Award for *A fight to the death*, a film on the Hutton Inquiry.

He first became an acting Senior Broadcast Journalist at Newsnight in 2005, when he co-produced Jeremy Paxman's 2005 General Election interviews with Richard Colebourne, which were well received.

Since he began his tenure as a Senior Broadcast Journalist on Newsnight he has produced various films, including *Operation Crevice* with Richard Watson, Meirion Jones and Nick Menzies.

He is a member of New York University's Remarque Institute Forum.
